Discoveries about cancer causes rely on researchers' ability to explore trends in cancer incidence and related factors, which depends on the active participation of individuals, such as HOP Public Navigators—participants with HOP accounts—who provide valuable information.

As studies close and new information emerges, HOP will provide participants with the findings from the studies they contributed to. These updates may lead to changes in the availability of genetic screenings, new cancer screening guidelines, or enhanced understanding of how our environments and lifestyles impact health. By contributing to studies like HOP, participants play a crucial role in shaping future prevention efforts.

**If you want to support cancer research, the solution is simple: continue completing the new surveys in your HOP account.** Your participation can significantly impact research outcomes over time, especially as new studies become available.

Soon, HOP surveys and studies will investigate environmental factors such as air and noise pollution, wildfire smoke health impacts, and preferences for new cancer screening methods. ### Meet Marit Simmons



## FAQ: My Account Says It's Disabled. What Should I Do?



HOP upgraded to a new platform at the end of last year, which means all **accounts appear disabled in the old version of the app**. If you see this message on your screen, you are likely using the outdated HOP app.

The previous version of the HOP app is still available in both app stores, which can cause some confusion. **To confirm you have the correct version, check that you see "Vibrent" under the name Healthy Oregon Project - HOP.**

To reactivate your HOP account, download the latest version of the app available for [Android](#) and [iPhone](#). You can also access your account through our website using the same login information. If it's your first time on the new platform, you'll need to reset your password. Click "Forgot Password" on the Log In page, enter the email address linked to your account, then follow the prompts to log in.
